
Background and Experience:

Much of that experience has involved modern intervention in period buildings in order to find sustainable futures. Gary also has expertise in environmental design and the integration of pragmatic sustainability in historic buildings.

Gary's particular skill lies in identifying appropriate and innovative responses to deal with the challenges of difficult contextual situations.

- Project Architect for new build community hub in Gorebridge, creating a mixed use, flexible facility. Construction is underway and the building is due to be fully operational by mid 2017.
- Project Architect for the conversion of St George's West Edinburgh into a new church with flexible and multi-purpose facilities for Charlotte Chapel.
- Project Associate and Designer for a new build church in Monifieth. The new building will unite the congregations of 3 existing churches in one purpose built facility.
- Project Associate and Designer for alterations at Queen's Cross Church, Aberdeen. At the heart of the project is the introduction of a new cafe enterprise, which will be located within the new entrance.
- Project Architect for the new community halls in Oxtou in the Scottish Borders. The project involved extensive community consultation and engagement and will provide improved, accessible and flexible public facilities.
- Project Architect for alterations to St Paul's and St George's Church, including a new glass entrance pavilion, 3 sided balconies and 3 storey extension, creating multi purpose facilities. Winner of EAA Building of the Year 2009.
- Team Architect on Garrison House, the restoration and rehabilitation of a listed public building on Cumbrae to provide a new museum, community and visitor facilities.
- Designer and Project Architect for a feasibility study for the redevelopment of the Marine Biological Station on the Isle of Cumbrae.

- Project Architect for Options Appraisal at Callendar House, Falkirk including detailed investigation of best use of building and estate. The A listed property which includes stables and out buildings is seen as a major component in the local tourist economy.
